Treasurer Update

- Doing good now
- The back end of the year is full of expenses, that's why we have a large amount of money now - we will be paying bills later in the year
- Parent's Night Out is the biggest night of the year for us (fundraising wise).
 - We're budgeted to make \$12,000. If we hit \$10,000 we will be short, if we hit \$11,000 we will break even, but if we make more than \$11,000 than we will have a surplus.
 - We are working on making a smoother checkout procedure to try to make it go faster

Art Residencies Update:

- The 2nd grade team has decided to go with the theme of mindfulness of the world around us and ourselves. The kids will develop stories and express them through Indian dance - a way for them to utilize their wiggleness.
- 5th grade is still deciding on their project

New Business

- Starting a Community Service Club:
 - This will be a new club for students
 - 10 weeks, doing service projects for our community (like packing lunches for firefighters)
 - Starting this spring, will be in the morning (8-8:50am), for grades 2nd-5th and the cost per student is \$110 (it might be lower in the future if we can get supplies donated - the cost will go to pay for the supplies for the projects). Will look into f the cost for parents could be a tax right off since going to projects of donation. Next year we will try to do a donation drive for the supplies.
 - It will be parent run
- At the recent District 65 Board Meeting there were 35 committee members that are trying to make D65 an Anti-Racist District
- Who's cage do we rattle to fix our gym floor? It's very slippery and a safety hazard
 - It was supposed to be fixed over the summer, but the district didn't get to it. Then it was supposed to be done over break, but didn't.
 - District's Building and Maintenance is who to contact.
 - There's a lot of other schools in the district with better upgrades - better gyms, better playgrounds - seems to get done when parents make a lot of noise
 - Put these types of comments/concerns in the Chatterbox and the committee will figure out a plan of action.
 - Sometimes it's all about awareness - go visit other schools in the District and see the difference
 - Some schools have received new build-ons
 - Something to keep in mind with these types of requests is we should look at both sides of the coin/the pluses and minuses that the project can bring. Like if we got an addition to our school, yes it would solve space issues, but we would grow in student numbers and possibly loose our small class sizes. Just need to consider everything first. How do we walk the line of getting our school's needs met but not lose the things we love about our school.
