Principal's Announcements:

Executive Committee Announcements:

- Bookfair Results: Super successful! The coin drive brought in over \$900. Ms. Rouse's class brought in the most, but a bunch of classes brought in big numbers. We used this money to fund \$8 book vouchers for all free/reduced lunch students 70 out of 115 vouchers were redeemed! We sold \$9,399.27 worth of books during the fair.

PTA Council Updates:

- Dec 10th meeting is open to all prepping for Black Lives Matter week
- A teacher from Dawes started a Black Chess Champions Club
- Looking into more LGBTQ+ training for parents about the curriculum
- Adapted from the National PTA by-laws about protecting rights for LGBTQ+, Park School added it to their by-laws and the PTA Council will be voting to add it to theirs at the next meeting.

New Business:

- Girl Scouts present bookstore recommendations
 - We have the largest troop in the district -47 girls across K-8th grade
 - This project earns them their bronze award
 - Worked with all the juniors in Girl Scouts
 - Suggestions for the Bookstore:
 - Seperate the older/younger kid books make it easier to find wanted books, can put one store upstairs and one downstairs
 - Let kids make book suggestions to put in store
 - Possibly let kids pay with Paws
 - Have mostly books, but some fun pencils & erasers
 - If a kid donates a book they can take a book
 - Have open every Friday or every other Friday and at school events
 - The Girl Scouts can help run the stores, but not be the lead/in charge
 - There should be books that are hard to get at the library, so more incentive to use
 - Not sure on the location of the one on the 2nd floor don't want to put in the library so books don't get confused with store ones vs library ones.

- The challenge was to narrow down all of our ideas to the doable/realistic ones working through all of the options and having to agree on them.
- We did a lot of brainstorming, put in a lot of effort/teamwork.
- We got help from many people and want to thank them our leaders, Ms. Hertel, Ms. Hall and everyone else who played a part.
- It was a seamingly simple project, but had a lot of complicated issues.
- We want to thank the Girl Scouts for their work on this project and for helping clean out the current books in the store.
- Vote on Teacher Grant for LGBTQ+ books
 - Request from Ms. Bardic, wanting a set of LGBTQ+ books for the classroom. We liked the idea and wanted to expand it and get multiple sets for the library so the whole school can use them.
 - We asked Ms. Hertel if she'd like to join the request if she had other titles to add and to see what we had already.
 - The ask is for 30 different books that are LGBTQ+ themed to live in the library for students and teachers to use. The cost will be no more than \$500. Ms. Bardic's titles are around \$150 and Ms. Hertel's titles are around \$300.
 - o Darlena put the motion out, Mya 2nd it, all were in favor vote Passed
- Vote on Teacher Grant for author visit
 - Ms. Hertel has a request for \$400 to have an author visit during school for 4th & 5th grade (it's an author of
 one of the Bibliomania books the district reading program). The author cost has been split with Bessie
 Rhodes and the airfare cost is split with 6 different schools.
 - We have \$1,500 in the budget for teacher grants. We didn't have any last year, and we don't have any others yet.
 - Mya put the motion out, Ellen 2nd it, all were in favor vote Passed
 - We should look at events for other grades as well.
- Bathroom Improvement Grant December Vote
 - School ask plan to paint (sand, prime & paint all stalls) both sets of bathrooms (1st and 2nd floor), motivational decals, and a sensory mural decal that will go by the gym.
 - Total cost is \$1900 (\$900 for the paint and decals and \$1,000 for the sensory mural)
 - We want to wait on this vote until next month so we can see how Walkerfest does.
 - We do have \$4,000 budgeted for "teacher support" (which we want to rename to "school support"). We have in the past used this money to give the teachers gift cards at the end of the year, but would like to use the money for a gift to the whole school.
- PNO (parent questions):
 - Need to raise \$6,000 to cover the art residences, hoping to raise \$15,000 total
 - Art residences have been at Walker before any of the exec board got to the school. We're not sure if other schools have something similar.
 - Just wanting to look at the big picture. Are these still wanted? Is this something the district could pay for?
- Bookstore: If anyone would like to take on a project, we need a lead to run this!
