## **Principal's Announcements**

#### **Teacher Announcements**

- Lisa Levine is the SLP, started in January 2009, 18<sup>th</sup> year in district, has worked in more than six buildings. Walker is a really special school. Many teachers agreed that they would like to share parents may have heard some grumblings in our community and on forums. Walker teachers and educators feel very supported and valued by our local admins. Parents, please submit public comments to board meetings.
- Spirit Week was awesome, but teachers would like more input on which days and information
  did not include non-classroom educators. Edie Hertel is the lead on morning announcements
  and liaison between room parent coordinator, so including events like Spirit Week in
  announcements would help non-classroom teachers learn what's happening school wide.
- Amy Hudson-Meier has worked 30 years in the district, including with special ed inclusion students.
- Bridget McGough is the EEL teacher and has been at Walker since 2009 as well.
- Jonathan Ibach is a first-year music teacher from WI. He has felt very supported by everyone down here.
- This has been a harder year than teaching virtually with all students returning and a lot of changes at the beginning of the year, including curriculum.

## **Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee Update**

- Tracy Ellison from Next Steps joining us to provide an overview.
  - Addressing roles of parents and caregivers in diversity and equity within D65.
  - Dante Wharton tried to get a Walker group together before 11/19 deadline for the next cohort, but it did not happen.
  - o Tracy Ellison is a Walker alum and Mrs. HP was her favorite teacher.

- Next Steps started in 2016 with parents and educators from Nichols' PTA discussing the book "Despite the Best Intentions." Discussed opportunity hoarding, curriculum, and more.
- Book seemed to be based on a community like Evanston's diversity, opportunity gap, but they were told it is not Evanston specifically.
- Different iterations over the years, including a cohort model starting in the first pandemic year.
- Parents, educators, and principals are all invited to participate. Ask for at least 3, up to
   6-8 parents and staff from each school.
- Goal is to take a look at policies, practices, programs that have racist connotations with an anti-racism lens.
- Four to five-month intensive to look at case studies that are currently happening within the district
- Affinity (for minority groups) and accountability (for white identifying people) spaces are
  offered
- Final project to offer solutions to racism problems surrounding curriculum, educators, library offerings.
- Each group is given a coach skilled in group management, conflict resolution, and equity to guide their learning.
- SEED is a 10-month intensive that sets the foundation for anti-racism and equity within the educational system. Next Steps allows one to practice anti-racism and equity work with action.
- Studio sessions are when the affinity and accountability groups met. Application sessions are when the school groups gather to work on their case studies and final projects.
- Expectation for schools and PTAs to help with the cost. This session schools were asked to support a technology person, translators, and perhaps baby-sitting costs.
- We would need to apply next year at the beginning of the school year.
- Application asks about your diversity training (SEED, Beyond Diversity, Next Steps). All
  coaches have participated in all of these programs and understand what information
  and ideas have been presented.
- Ms. Arceneaux and Ms. Tertulien are starting a program named Black Boy Joy.
  - They are putting together five programs from a Black and brown professional perspective (horticulturist, hero-policeman or firefighter).
  - Working on t-shirts and a logo.
