

Attendance

The Walker School Attendance Line has been organized to help determine whether absent children are ill or if they have not arrived to school on time. The Health Clerk makes calls between 9:30 and 10:00 am to homes of all children marked absent.

If your child is going to be absent, please call the Attendance Line anytime before 9:00 am (evenings and weekends are ok) each morning for the duration of the absence. When you call, please state the child's name, your name & relationship, and reason for the absence.

If your child is tardy, they must check in at the Health Office and get a pass to give to their homeroom teacher.

If your child needs to leave school early, please call the school office to make arrangements. Your child will need to be signed out from school in the Health Office.

Homework Policy

Homework will be given at the discretion of the individual teacher. Contact your teacher for more details.

Lunch

At the start of each school day the homeroom teachers will take the lunch orders. Each student will tell his/her teacher if they brought a sack lunch or wish to order a school lunch. Walker School offers breakfast and lunch to all students. The cost for breakfast is \$2.25 and the cost for lunch is \$3.50. Extra milk may be purchased for \$0.60. Students can pay for meals daily or in advance, in which case the money will be placed into his/her account. Meal accounts can be setup online at www.MySchoolBucks.com or students can bring in cash or check to school. Please make sure that payment is sent in a sealed envelope clearly marked with the child's name, the teacher's name/homeroom number and "Lunch Money" on it. Checks can be made out to "District 65 Nutrition Services". Pre-paid deposits should be given to the child's teacher or directly to Nutrition Services Staff. Free and reduced price meals are available. Applications for free and reduced meals must be submitted every school year and are available online. School Age Child Care (SACC)

Before school care is available beginning at 7:00 am. Children remain in morning childcare until the school day begins. Students attending the before-school program will be offered a healthy breakfast to start their day.

After-school childcare services begin immediately following dismissal at 3:35pm. Children must be picked up no later than 6:00 pm. Students attending the afterschool program will be offered a healthy snack.

Space in the District 65 School Age Childcare (SACC) program is limited and availability is on a first-come, first-served basis. Per DCFS guidelines, there are several documents required to complete the annual childcare registration process. Applications must be completed each school year and are only considered complete when all documents have been received by the Childcare Office. 

Six Decades Of Learning!

Walker School was constructed in 1961 and dedicated in the spring of 1962. The school is named after David E. Walker who came to District #76 (which encompassed the South end of Evanston) in 1918 as Assistant Superintendent to Mr. Nichols. In 1928 Nichols School was opened and Mr. Walker became the principal, while he was acting as Assistant Superintendent. He remained in that position until the two school districts were consolidated in 1950. At that time, after serving the district for 32 years, Mr. Walker retired.

Health Office

The Health Office is located on the first floor near the main office. There is a full-time health clerk on duty during regular school hours. If a student becomes sick or injured, they will be sent to the health office. The health clerk will administer first aid of a minor nature. If after observation, the illness or injury appears to warrant contact of a parent, reasonable effort will be made to contact parents. Parents may be requested to come and pick up a student at that time. If there is an extreme emergency, paramedics will be called and the child will be taken to Skokie Hospital. If your child is complaining of not feeling well, please do not send them to school. Please keep them home for the duration of the illness. If your child will be absent, you must phone the health clerk on the attendance line. Extended absences require the completion of the Extended Absence Form, available in the Health Office. Emergency information is completed during school registration. During the school year, if changes are made in employment, telephone number, or alternate contacts, please call the main office (847-859-8350) or the health office (847-859-8352).



DROP OFF AND PICK UP PROCEDURES



These rules pertain to the hours of 8:50 am - 9:05 am and 3:15 pm - 3:45 pm. A map is included on the next page.

Morning Drop Off: Students may be dropped off starting at 8:50am. No student may be dropped off to the playground prior to 8:50 am as there is no adult supervision provided by the school. If your child arrives after 9:05am, they must come to the main office for a tardy pass. Parents are not permitted to walk their child to class.

Afternoon Pick Up: Students aged 5-8 must be handed to a designated guardian upon pick up on the K-2 playground. Students aged 9 and above do not need to be handed off to a guardian upon pick up. Pick up is at 3:35 pm or at 12:05pm on designated early dismissal days.

Parking At and Around Walker

Parking is widely available in the neighborhood especially on Arcadia and Davis. Please see the corresponding map on the following page.



Parking is allowed in the West parking lot (by the 3-5 playground) but only in designated parking spaces. Do not park in the fire lane.

DO NOT park or leave car unattended in the drop-off/pick-up lane on Central Park Ave.

DO NOT park or leave car unattended in crosswalks or fire lanes.

Double or triple parking will not be tolerated. Drivers engaging in these behaviors are subject to being ticketed by the Skokie Police Department.

NO PARKING in the East parking lot (in front of the school) during pick-up and drop-off. This area is designated for buses only.



School begins for all students at 9:05am. The first bell rings at 9:00am. Students are dismissed at 3:35pm.



Using the Drop-off/Pick-up Lanes

There are two designated drop-off/pick-up lanes:

1. The West side of Central Park Ave. South of Church in front of the K-2 playground; and
2. Curbside in the West parking lot in front of the 3-5 playground.

There is absolutely no parking or leaving the car unattended in the drop-off/pick up lanes.

Transportation

The District 65 Transportation Department works alongside the school bus companies and families to provide safe and efficient service for students to and from school. The district provides free student transportation for elementary students who reside 1.5 miles or more from their attendance area school or reside where walking to school or to the bus stop would constitute a serious safety hazard.

Families are encouraged to call the District 65 Transportation Department directly with questions or concerns regarding bus stops, bus routes, or bus drivers.
